1. Programmes Reflecting Goals and Objectives

Like every year, this year also the college organized various programmes reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution. The mission of our college is 'Varam Strihitam Dheyam' and to fulfill this mission we hold programmes related to women welfare and empowerment.

A special lecture on "Impact of Globalization on women" was held in which Mr. Vilas Sonawane was the guest speaker. In his speech he pointed out that since ages women are being treated as an object in the patriarchal system of the society. The male dominated society has kept her in the four walls of the house and forced her to do only the household works. She is denied her right to express and make decisions. So to get her fundamental right of being equal with men, she has to fight against the patriarchal system of the society.

A one day programme was organized on Sant Gadgebaba on his death anniversary. On this occasion Mr. Harish Ithape, renowned social activist, delivered a lecture on the topic "Thoughts of Sant Gadgebaba on False Beliefs and Today's Women". Mr. Ithape narrated the tale of how hi-tech Baba's through TV Channels have taken the advantage of women's false beliefs. Once the women fall prey into their trap, they become victims of physical, mental and sexual harassments. While belief has a scientific background, false belief is simply a fantasy. Though Gadgebaba was illiterate, his thoughts and beliefs had scientific base. Hence he appealed the students to believe only those things which can be proved scientifically.

A one day seminar was organized by social Science study circle to mark the birth anniversary of Savitribai Fule. The Topic of the seminar was 'Security of Women and Indian Society.' The invited guests for the seminar were Mr. Avinashkumar, superintendent of police, Wardha, advocate Kalpana Burhan, social activist Hasina Gorde and Amin Ali Azani. In his speech Mr. Avinashkumar focused on the reasons for the rise of sexual harassment against women. He told that in many cases neither the victim nor the family members complain to the police. He appealed the women students to come forward and take initiative in their locality so that rape cases are registered in the Police Station. He also answered all the queries put by the students.

Jagar-Janiv-Abhiyan (Campaign)

In the 21st century, the Indian Society is facing a lot of challenges. Apart from this, the traditional caste based system and sex linked disparity still persist in the nation. Equality in both sexes and casteless system of society, therefore, has become the need of the day. To educate every individual of the society, the Maharashtra Govt. has taken an initiative in the form of "Jagar Janeev Abhiyan" which primarily focuses on educating the students equality of both sexes and to build a nation above caste and creed.

As a part of the above campaign, the college has taken the initiative to work on equality of both sexes. To carry forward the campaign a functional group comprising of students, staff

members and parents was formed and their suggestions were sought. As per their suggestions, various programmes such as seminar on sex linked discrimination, programme motivating women to choose their life partner, educating women to be aware of their legal rights, display of films and plays on male-female equality, and steps to prevent untoward incidents like eve-teasing and sexual harassments were organized. A short play “Mulgi Zali Ho” was displayed to make the parents aware of the importance of a girl child.

The students of the college joined 'SANMAN RALLY' to mark protest against Delhi rape and murder case. To get an idea about the functioning of the police department the women students visited the police station and interacted with Police subinspector Mrs Shilpa Bharde. This helped them shed fear for police.

It is noteworthy that our institution got the second prize for 'JAGAR-JANEEV ABHIYAN' from Government of Maharashtra.

Earn and Learn Scheme

A programme was organized by Home-economics department under self employment scheme. In this programme Principal Dr. R.H. Sonaye appealed the students to develop their skill for making toys, readymade garments and food items that can help them to earn while they learn. She presented various self employment options with suitable examples and asked the students to choose from the options available for them.

To motivate the students towards self employment the department arranged a visit of the students to Mahatma Gandhi Industrial Rural Institute, Wardha. The MGIRI gave training on textile, biotechnology, solar energy, crafts, printing, manufacturing of bags, cards, shampoos, face wash, phenyl etc. The students got inspired from this training which is a step towards self employment.

3. Increase in Infrastructure

There had been a demand for a women's hostel by the students coming from nearby rural areas for many years, To meet their pressing demand women's hostel has been constructed under X UGC plan. The hostel is now ready for accommodation to the students of the villages.

4. Extension and Community Services

Under NSS activities different programmes were conducted. The programmes are as under:

A week long special camp was held on 20th January to 3rd February at 'Bapukuti', Sewagram. The camp was inaugurated by Mr. Kumar Prashant, Secretary of National Youth Organisation. In his inaugural speech he stressed on the need of village development which can be done by NSS volunteers. During the week-long camp various cultural programmes and guest lectures were held.

5. Academic and Cultural Activities

For the intellectual development of students, Department of Marathi conducted several programmes. As a tradition, the department publishes a wallpaper called "PHOENIX" every year, This year too, to mark the Birth Centenary of late Shri Bapuraoji Deshmukh "Phonix" was published HIGHLIGHTING THR LIFE AND WORKKS OF Bapuraoji Deshmukh was inaugurated by Shri Vasantao Karlekar, Ex MLA and Dr. B.K. Khadse, secretary, Shri Bapuraoji Deshmukh Foundation, Sewagram. Principal Dr. Vilas Deshmukh was guest of honor on this occasion. The programme was co-ordinated by Principal, Dr. Rambha Sonaye, and Dr. Anita Deshmukh HOD, Marathi Department. "Karmayogi" a film on the life of late Shri Bapuraoji Deshmukh was shown.

The college organized its annual day under the programme "Jalosh" in which students exhibited various cultural items like dance, drama and mimicry. The purpoe of this programme was to give the students platform for their potential development .

6. Sports Activities

The sports department carried on many programmes to mark the birth anniversary of late Shri Bapuraoji Deshmukh, the founder member of our college.

A medical camp for teenaged students of this college and Jijamata school was held. A team of doctors from Jawaharlal Medical College, Sawangi conducted the Gynaecological checkup of the students.

Students of our college participated in various competitions such as district level Volleyball Tournament, Yoga Competition, inter collegiate Kabaddi competition, interclass sports competition etc. The winners of the competitions were given prizes for their performance. Miss Seema Dubey was given the best athlete award for her outstanding performance in sports. Miss Kanchan Giradkar and Yogita Bawane participated in All India Yoga Competition which was held at Bhavnagar, Gujrat.

The 'KRIDAJYOT' of interuniversity "Ashwamedh Krida Spardha 2013" which passed through Wardha was welcomed by Principal, Dr. R.H. Sonaye, It was an honor for our college to light the state level 'KRIDAJYOT'.

7. Environmental Programmes

On the completion of one year of tree plantation, our college celebrated Tree Anniversary Day in collaboration with Nisarga Seva Samiti, Wardha. The trees which were planted last year at ITI' premises were taken due care throughout the year and Nisarga Seva Samiti lauded the efforts of the students for the conservation of the trees.

On 31st January 2013, a tree plantation programme was organized in association with Nisarga Seva Samiti at Hutatma Smarak, Sewagaram. Mr. Murlidhar Belkhode, President of Nisarga Seva Samiti explained to the students the importance of trees for environmental protection.

8. Unique Activities

To mark World Human Rights Day on 11th Dec. 2012, The college organised a programme on Indian Constitution and Human Rights. Dr. M.H.Khanjode, Principal, Samarth Mahavidyalaya, Ashti, was the chief speaker. Speaking on the occasion Dr. Khanjode opined that Lord Gautam Buddha, Sant Kabir and Mahatma Jyotiba Fule were the advocates of equal rights to all human beings. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar through Indian Constitution made provision of the fundamental human rights that gave quality to all citizens of the country.

On 25th January 2013, a symposium was held in the college to mark the "National Voters Day". The topic of the symposium was "Voter's Right to Choose the Able Person for the Development of the Nation." All the speakers confessed that only the voters can change the fate of the country by choosing the right person as their representative. At the end of the programme all the staff members and students took the oath that they must cast their vote in every election and will choose a person who can develop the entire region.

9. Other Activities

In memory of the Architect of Indian Constitution Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar a special programme was arranged on 6th December 2012. Dr. Subhash Khandare a renowned speaker on Ambedkar Thoughts addressed the students on the life and achievements of Dr. Ambedkar
